The Student Non-violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) was born out of the sit-ins of the early 1960's. In April of that year, the students who had been leading these protest demonstrations cane together for a conference in Rallegh, North Carolina. They raw a need for s centralized communications system and for some sort of coordination among the various campus groups.

Today, the Student Non-violent Coordinating Committee is involved in a number of projects to change the patterns of racial segregation in the South. Among the most pressing are the voter registration drives being conducted in twenty-six counties in Mississippi, Alabama, and Georgia. The work that these students are doing there is slow, it is dangerous, it is lonely. They are constantly being intimidated through threats, beatings, and jailings. They have jeopardized their lives, interrupted their educations, and separated themselves from their family and friends. All this they are doing in an attempt to make denocracy more of a reality.

To carry out their work, SNCC employs a full time staff of students receiving from \$5 to \$10 a week for living expenses. There is no other money available to them. They are walking twelve to thirty miles a day in rural areas because there is no other transportation available to them.

These students are the only group which has aired any large program in rural voter registration. The rural vote is the key to political and thus, educational and economic change in the South. It is to carry on this work that we appeal to you for funds. Contributions should be made payable to the Lansing Area Friends of SNCC and mailed to the address on the letterhead.

These students are engaged in a real battle--the outcome of which affects every citizen of the United States. If they lose this battle, it will not be because their opponents are too strong, but because their supporters are too apathetic. We must not default our responsibility to support them.
